"O Champion General, I your City now inscribe to you triumphant anthems as the tokens of my gratitude, being rescued from the terrors, O Theotokos. Inasmuch as you have power unassailable, From all kinds of perils free me, so that unto you I may cry aloud: Rejoice, O unwedded Bride."

One of the most beloved hymns of the Lenten Season is T_i Yrepudxw Στρατηγῷ /O Champion General. It is sung the first 5 Sundays of Lent as well as during the Friday Night Salutation or Akathist services. The hymn itself is sung from the perspective of a city which is crying out and giving thanks to the Theotokos for her protection from a siege. This is why she is referred to as the Champion General. She marshals the powers of heaven to protect the inhabitants from the dangers outside their walls.

The City of Constantinople would need just such a General when it came under siege for the first time in 626AD. For a month, the city maintained high morale even though they were under constant bombardment from 80,000 Avar troupes. Chanting this very hymn, the inhabitants of Constantinople regularly processed an Icon of the Virgin Mary around the walls of the city, even though doing so would put them in range of the enemy. Under the protection of their Champion General Constantinople rebuffed the attacks and was able to drive away their enemy.

T_Π Υπερμάχω Στρατηγῶ/O Champion General eventually became a vital hymn during the Lenten Season because of the symbolism of warfare and deliverance. The warfare we experience during Lent is spiritual.

Maybe our defenses have been weakened through fasting, ie maybe we are a little more tired, or irritable. The enemy sees our vulnerability and strikes. We come under attack from our thoughts, temptations, and sins. Left to our own defense we may be overtaken.

The Friday Salutation services during Lent are our version of the procession around the city walls. Like the people of Constantinople, we gather to cry out to the Theotokos asking for her defense and deliverance from the sins that war against us. Our battle with sin is most pronounced during the period of Lent, making our prayer to the Theotokos all the more opportune.

Join the Salutation services each Friday of Lent, asking our Champion General to "Entreat your Son and our Lord and Master, using your boldness as a mother, so that he may open to me the loving mercy of his goodness" (Compline Prayer to the Theotokos).




