

#### Christ is Risen! Χριστός Ανέστη!

For the majority of this month we will continue in the joy and light of the Resurrection of Christ, yet we will end the month with the conclusion of Pascha and the celebration of our Lord's ascension. After His resurrection, He appeared among His disciples and followers, and beginning at Moses and all the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the scriptures the things concerning Himself (Luke 24:27). When the time had come, after forty days, Christ gave His final commands to His disciples, and ascended into Heaven. This year we will celebrate the feast of Ascension on May 25th.

It is those final commands that I would like us to think about this May. The Evangelists tell us that Christ's last words were a commission to preach and spread the Gospel to all:

"Repentance and remission of sins should be preached in His name to all nations." (Luke 24:47)

And He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." (Mark 16:15)

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:18)

St. Matthew describes sharing the faith and bringing others into the Church as a COMMANDMENT of God, something that is in fact required of us. Many of us might feel intimidated by this, or that it is not actually our place to "preach" to others. The best way for us to begin is exactly as Christ began with His disciples. As He called them, He used the simple phrase: Come and See. The Lord has worked wonders in your life, and will work wonders in the lives of those you invite. Share with those around you the blessings, challenges, and mercy that God has bestowed on you. And then, invite them to Come and See.

As Christ ascends, He shares with us the responsibility for introducing the world to God. What a beautiful and heavy gift He gives. But He does not leave us without help. The upcoming feast of Pentecost celebrates God sending His Holy Spirit upon the members of the Church to give us the strength and power to fulfill His Ascension Commandment. Let us take strength from the last days of Pascha, before turning our attention to evangelizing all nations.

# Why do we wear our wedding rings on our right hand?

Given that we are about to enter into wedding season this seems like a very timely question. While it is culturally more common in the United States to wear the wedding ring on the left hand, that is not a universal practice. In many European countries the cultural practice is to wear the wedding ring on the Right hand. Although much of the preference comes down to cultural differences, for the Orthodox wearing the wedding ring on the right hand is a theological statement.

In the scriptures the right hand is always a place of honor, especially when compared against the left hand, take the separation of the sheep and the goats in Matthew 25. The righteous sheep are placed at the right hand of God, while the unrighteous goats take their place at the left hand of God. Moreover, in the book of Exodus, the Israelites sing a hymn praising God for delivering them from Pharoah by His Right Hand: "Your Right hand, O God, is glorified in strength; Your right hand, O God, dashed the enemies in pieces" (Exodus 15:6).

When the priest blesses the couple's wedding rings, he references this verse of Exodus and the blessing of God's right hand.

"Your own right hand, Lord, armed Moses in the Red Sea; by the word of Your truth were the heavens established and the foundations of the earth made firm; and the right hands of Your servants shall likewise be blessed by Your mighty word and Your upraised arm" (Prayer of the Blessing of the Rings).

So during the wedding service we are asking God that the couple be granted the strength of God's right hand, which protects and creates. By putting the rings on the right hand, we remind the couple that their marriage is a source of blessing for them, and that it calls them to live a holy life. If their right hand is blessed to symbolically imitate God's right hand, then their whole marriage by extension is to symbolically imitate God's life. That is essentially the same point that St. Paul makes about marriage in Ephesians 5:20-33, which is the Epistle read at Orthodox weddings.






