

As diverse as America is culturally, there seems to be one thing that unites us all in the current age, Busyness. How many times have we had the following conversation:

- "Hey, how have you been."
- "Oh, you know, busy."
- "Yea, me too. We've got so much going on."

Busy has become our default state of being. As a nation, we have a culture of busyness. We are busy with work, putting in more hours than ever before. We are busy with social media, where we hustle to present the perfect content to our followers. We are busy with school, where it seems we are doing more resume/college application curating than actual learning. We are busy with recreation, where even our free-time is dictated by keeping up with the pace of others vacations and hobbies

Busyness has become so ingrained in our culture as modern Americans that it has become a virtue. We keep busy to show those around us that we are the kind of people that have an important job, are a successful student, or proficient athlete, or influence with our followers. This has been the case for years now as evidenced by a 2017 article in The Atlantic titled 'Ugh, I'm So Busy': A Status Symbol for Our Time.

In such a culture, busyness becomes the most effective tool of the evil one. If we are busy, our attention is too fragmented, or our minds too anxious to experience the presence of God. We are on guard against the devil's attacks on our faith but have missed his offensive on our calendars. He doesn't need to tempt us to reject the Lord. He just needs to add more and more to our plate so that sports replace worship, work replaces mercy, our phones replace the scriptures, and anxiety replaces prayer.

Stillness then is a necessary practice for Christians, as God encourages in the Psalms, "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 45:11). More than simply slowing down, we need to take moments to be still, quiet, and restful.

With the start of the Ecclesiastical and ministry year, as a parish we want to focus on this practice: Prayerful Stillness. In our ministries this year we will have opportunities to learn how to embody what the Orthodox tradition calls Hysechia or Stillness in mind, body, and soul. Separate Men's & Women's Small Groups will gather to push back against the culture of busyness. Our Reliquary Room will be available for private reflection in the presence of the saints.

God beckons us to leave busyness for the sake of our souls, when He invites, "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). Within the counter-cultural practice of stillness we come to salvation and the knowledge of truth (1 Tim. 2:4).





 It encompasses more than just financial contributions; it includes the generosity of volunteerism and the dedication of our time and talents.


These principles should guide us not only in our church life but also in all aspects of our daily lives. They should serve as the foundation for how we give our Time, Talents, and Treasures.


SPIRITUAL GROWTH

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN: 25 BY 25

I hope you and your loved ones are all well and that you are enjoying the summer. For many of us, the summer months are a time for extra outdoor activity; going on a long bike ride, the swimming pool, long walks or hikes in our favorite park. We may not realize it at the time, but being outdoors and engaged in a physical activity has many benefits including teaching us simple life lessons.

The other day, while cleaning up my garage I came across an old pair of hiking boots. My discovery brought back the memory of a summer long ago and my six-day back packing trip on the Appalachian Trail with my son's boy scout troop. The first several days of our trip were very difficult and at the time not much fun. As we hiked the Trail through humid Georgia and into North Carolina, a terrible rainstorm, and multiple winding trails we gained elevation through the thick forest eventually coming upon a clearing. Through the clearing, a few feet from the trail, there was a ledge. As we stood on that ledge we could see the valley floor below us and how far we had climbed. Instantly the sun seemed brighter, we were happier, our spirits were lifted, we realized our hard work was paying off and we were energized to reach the next summit on our trip.

That experience hiking the Appalachian Trail, reminds me of our Capital Campaign and how far we have come on our journey together! To put things into perspective, at the beginning of the year, on January 1, 2024, our mortgage balance was \$191,895.15. As of June 30, 2024, with the help of 64 very generous donors, in six short months, our mortgage balance has been reduced to \$55,915.86!!

As we stand on the ledge high above the valley floor and reflect on how far we have come let's not forget that our journey is not yet complete and that we have several summits to climb to reach our Phase I and II goals. Our next summit, or goal, on our journey is to eliminate our debt by the Church's 60th anniversary.

This was our original plan on our way to the ultimate mountain top but we are adjusting our plan in order to get us to the top much quicker. I am confident that with your help we can eliminate our mortgage by the feast day of our patron saint, January 18, 2025.

To that end, I ask that for the next six months our goal is 25 by 25. Let's raise \$25,000 by the beginning of 2025. If we reach that goal, we can begin 2025 with no mortgage and begin to focus on our church's structural needs six months sooner than planned. If 100 stewards, step forward with a one-time donation to the Capital Campaign of just \$250 we will reach this next summit in our journey together.

Let's work together to make 25 by 25 a reality!




