

"You were transfigured upon the mountain, O Christ our God, showing to Your disciples Your glory as much as they could bear. Do also in us, sinners though we may be, shine Your everlasting light, by the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Giver of light. Glory to You." (Hymn of the Transfiguration, Aug. 6th)

Every feastday from the life of Christ is simultaneously a feastday for us as His followers. The Transfiguration is no exception to this rule. The story of the Transfiguration is found in Matthew 17, where Christ takes His three most trusted disciples with Him to pray on Mount Tabor. While there He was transfigured, or His form changed, so that His disciples were blinded by the divine light radiating from Christ. The force of Jesus's divinity, shining forth as light, quite literally knocked His disciples on the ground.

At this occasion, Peter, James, and John were blessed to see what in fact was always there, the power and energy of God fully present within Jesus Christ. They witnessed "the true light which, coming into the world, gives light to every man" (John 1:9). They marvel at the realization that the one standing in front of them, Jesus Christ, is clearly shown to be the Son of God, Light of Light, True God of True God.

The Christian faith is about living in Christ, being united to Him, so that He shares with us all that is His. That is why what we observe in the Transfiguration is the pinnacle of the Christian life. Many saints throughout their lives have lived a holiness that completely unites them with Christ, so that Christ is alive in them. These saints often shine with the Divine light of the Transfiguration when they pray. Moses himself shone forth with such splendor and light after receiving the commandments that the Israelites asked him to wear a veil to protect them from the glory of God that emanated from his face.

By showing His divinity to His disciples, Christ both showed them who He truly is and at the same time showed them what they are called to become. Thus St. Irenaios explains, "The Glory of God is man fully alive" (St. Irenaios of Lyon. A.H. 4.20.7). When we are alive in Christ we shine with His light and glory.

What a great calling for Christians, to live and shine the very glory and light of God in a world so consumed by darkness and dread. When we have turned away from sin and are fully alive in Christ, His light shines through us. This light drives out the darkness and the darkness cannot overtake it. As we celebrate our Lord's Transfiguration, I pray that we pursue our own transfiguration, living in Christ, shining with His glory, and driving out darkness wherever we find it.






