
All women of the church are welcome to join us at to our fall kickoff, Mezze and Membership on Saturday, September 13th at noon in St. Matthew Hall.

STEWARDSHIP

Understanding Stewardship Data: Strengthening Our Church's Future Part 3

Every month the Stewardship Committee shares information and data with you regarding our 2025 Stewardship Campaign. This month we are going to change things a bit. Yes ... we are still going to share some data with you, but then we are going to ask you for your input. By getting your input, we can help drive change and progress within our Stewardship program.

Topic 1:

When we introduced our 2025 Stewardship program in late 2024, we presented a 2025 goal that was 15% greater than our 2024 Stewardship level. This was our first step in the journey to achieving Stewardship Independence. Through the end of July, 61 or 26% of the Pledged 2025 Stewards have increased their commitment over 2024.

Question:

Why haven't more Stewards increased their year-over-year pledge in 2025? Besides financial limitations, what other barriers exist that prevent Stewards from increasing their pledge?

Topic 2:

About 60 of the 2024 Stewards have not yet made their 2025 commitment. When we ask them why they have not yet made their commitment, the answer is typically "we make our commitment late in the year and pay it then".

Question:


What prevents Stewards from making their commitment when the program is kicked-off and pay it when they want to? Also, are there other reasons why they have not made their 2025 commitment?








AGAPE MINISTRY

Long before Taylor Swift ever existed, Rose Pagonis, since the age of 17, exuded boldness wearing her signature red lipstick and still rocks it today. "Mom had Alzheimer's experiencing memory loss for 14 years!," revealed Rose. "Everybody told us to keep it quiet when we found out Mom had Alzheimer's. I did the opposite. I told everyone!" Volunteering for the Alzheimer's Association for 25 years as a Community Educator, Rose's driven compassionate fiery spirit is fully displayed when speaking at libraries and Zoom providing a 'Program for Caregivers and Its Impact on Caregivers.' "I'm passionate about it!," she emphasizes. "Throughout the region, people are calling for support because it's anonymous. The Ten Signs of Alzheimer's. It's prevalent!"

"In 1985, (brother) John dated and married a girl (Irene Vlahos) in Aurora of all places! Driving from Chicago, it seemed like forever. Work brought my family to Naperville in 1989. In 1990, we joined Saint Athanasios...different from our previous good parish where everybody was very Greek. Saint Athanasios felt like a family. Everybody knew each other. A bit more progressive, Fr. Chris Constantinides mostly spoke English. Those early years, my kids and I loved being at church 5-6 times per week seeing our respective friends. JOY. GOYA. Attending church as families. Apollo Dance Troupe. Connecting with people. Staying in touch. Fun Greek School and New Year's Eve dances. My adult kids and grandchildren love attending Saint Athanasios' Divine Liturgies with their cousins. (Son) Alex met Chrissie in Sunday School becoming sweethearts. Since she was young, Chrissie felt like my daughter. As our kids grew up together, I made friends...now, grandchildren are growing up together. I'm hoping to live to see them grow in their Faith!"

+MARSHALL'S ETERNAL LOVE FOR HIS BEAUTIFUL ROSE AND FAMILY

"When (daughter) Diane was in 8 th grade, she asked parishioner Marshall Finch to take me out," Rose humorously confessed. "After three months of spending time with my entire family, Marshall asked if we could go out on our own. I was 37 years old when I met him. With Marshall, I was friends. My father +George told me, 'This is something you should take seriously.' Marshall was the kindest human being, possessing the most integrity of anybody I have ever known. It was natural. Very organic. Marshall was wonderful with my kids. A unique relationship! I would never have gone to look for him. My parents adored him. 15 years married to Marshall! I never asked him to convert. He wanted to convert. Marshall expressed, 'I am going to convert for our family so when we attend church together, we'll be in church together as one family!' He loved this parish so much becoming very involved."

Rose reflected, "I've had my share of setbacks and have faults. Feeling so much gratitude for the goodness and Grace I have in my life! God has been so good to my family. I love growing older with my two brothers and sisters-in-law. Blessed beyond measure! We are strong because of the love and support of my +parents and family."





In the late 1960s, +JIM AND MARTHA LESIOTIS moved to Montgomery, Illinois, joined Saint Athanasios and became lifelong members! Martha, +Jim's beloved wife for 57 years, joyfully recalled, "I met Jim in church in Rockford. He was a very kind, nice Greek Orthodox man and good-looking, too! We made so many friends at Saint Athanasios who are still friends visiting and enjoying each other's homes and company, going out with many people... Harry and Ruby Kontos, Camation Kouvavas. Jim was happy to go to church! A hard-working family man protective of our children Teresa, John and Nancy, Jim started his own business owning "JL Produce" for 39 years—driving daily to Chicago at 2:00 am to purchase produce in bulk and deliver to Greek restaurants by 2:00 pm. Serving as parish council president (1970), Jim started selling raffle tickets for Saint Athanasios' Greek Festivals asking all of his clients to buy one ticket to support the parish. In return, clients wanted favors from him."

Without fanfare, +Jim, Martha, parishioner friends George and Stella Simios and others quietly labored because they love God and our Church. At the peak of his decades-long volunteer efforts during each Greek Food Festival, +Jim was selling 150+ raffle tickets X \$100 (USD) per ticket = raising \$15,000 (USD) in critically-needed income to support Saint Athanasios! +Jim accomplished something most of us would find incredibly difficult to do.
