
## MESSAGE FROM FR. PANAGIOTIS

Each new year begins with the radiant feast of Theophany—one of the most profound celebrations of our Orthodox faith. Theophany is both a remembrance of Christ's baptism in the Jordan, and the revelation of the Holy Trinity to the world. In that sacred moment, the voice of the Father declares the identity of the Son, and the Spirit descends in the form of a dove. Creation itself is renewed as Christ steps into the waters, sanctifying them and restoring the world to its intended purpose: to be filled with the presence and grace of God.

The feast is joyful and cosmic, yet deeply personal. The waters that Christ blesses are the same waters with which we bless our homes each year. Through the traditions of the Great Blessing of the Waters and the annual house blessings, the grace revealed at the Jordan is extended to our daily lives. The Church reminds us that Theophany is an active reality that reaches into our homes, our families, and our hearts.

House blessing is a treasured practice in our Orthodox tradition. When the priest enters a home carrying the Holy Water of Theophany, he brings with him the Church's prayer that Christ will dwell in that household, guard it from every evil, and fill it with peace. There is something profoundly beautiful about this simple ritual. It acknowledges that our homes—where we work, rest, laugh, pray, struggle, and grow—are not separate from our spiritual lives. Rather, they are extensions of the little church of our hearts.

Just as Christ descended into the Jordan to sanctify the waters, so too does He come into our homes to sanctify our daily living. It is a reminder that we are called to allow His presence to shape everything we do: how we speak to one another, how we use our time, how we prioritize prayer, how we cultivate virtue. A house blessing is not magic nor superstition; it is an act of faith. It is our way of saying, "Lord, this place—this family—belongs to You."





In December the Hesed House ministry prepared and served dinner for approximately 230 Hesed guests. 4 volunteers helped prep / cook, and 5 volunteers served at Hesed.



# HELLENIC FOUNDATION GRANT AWARD

On December 11, I was honored to represent St. Athanasios at the Hellenic Foundation annual grant awards event where 43 entities were awarded 61 grants totaling \$788,000. The Foundation focuses on supporting churches and Orthodox based jurisdictions in the Chicago area whose programs support clothing, feeding and sheltering individuals in critical areas, providing scholarships to students in need, programs to keep youth engaged with the church, families with special needs and Greek and other educational programs.

For the second year in a row, we were awarded a grant of up to \$5,000 for our Hesed House ministry for the upcoming year. (Grant matches what the church expends)

In 2025, the Hesed House ministry prepared and served dinners 6 times serving an estimated 250 men & women. Our Ministry also provided breakfast items over 15 days for an average of 250 per serving. (Doing the math, that's 5000 meals provided!).

Lastly, we also provided over 1,500 individual toiletry kits to Hesed House "guests" during their stay.

With the 2025 grant awarded for 2026 activities, we plan to continue our community efforts to "feed the hungry" through fellowship and love we have for our neighbors and are grateful to the support of the Hellenic Foundation for these efforts.




## DID YOU KNOW...?

### The First Part of the Divine Liturgy

*"Blessed is the Kingdom of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, now and ever unto ages of ages."* From that moment onwards, the earth around us begins to be transformed to a heavenly realm. The temple where the faithful have gathered now becomes a place for angels and archangels—it becomes God's palace! It is at this moment that Christ allows us to enter and see his Kingdom. What a great honor this is, and how very observant should we be at this time! The first act of the Divine Liturgy is the sign of the Cross formed by the priest with the sacred Gospel. This has a deeper meaning: the Divine Liturgy is the Kingdom of God and the Cross is the road that leads to it. The Cross is Christ the King's banner. It is the symbol of his Kingdom. He opened the formerly closed gates of Paradise for us.

"While living in Michigan, Argie and I wanted to move to a metropolitan area close to an Orthodox parish. My job at DOW Chemical brought us to Illinois. We looked at a map of the area and housing options. Our Kouμπάρα Chris is also Kouμπάροι with Fr. Chris and Angie Constantine whom we met at Ionian Village. Their realtor-parishioner Rose Pagonis led us to buying an Aurora property in 1992. We built our home in the good School District #204 and enrolled our young daughters Amalia, Markella, Aliki and (eventually) Anna in Saint Athanasios' Sunday School! I started going into the altar to help Fr. Chris—then, he began talking to me about the Diaconate. **Everything fell into place!** Very loving Parish Council leaders (cradle Orthodox and Orthodox converts) organized Saint Athanasios' Consecration...October 4-6, 1996. As that banquet's Master of Ceremonies, I was seated at the podium. My paperwork wasn't yet approved to become a Deacon. Fr. Chris understood I was antsy with no set date/answer. During his speech, +His Eminence Metropolitan Iakovos of Chicago turned to me announcing 'We will soon have an ordination!' Fr. Chris joked 'How was that?' Given one month's preparation, I was ordained to the Diaconate on November 16, 1996!," Archdeacon Vasilios fondly remembers.

Thoughtful Diakonissa Argie expressed **"I personally feel when we started in this parish, this is the first place where it felt like a family! It was so comforting to know we could come as a family to this very family-oriented parish! The New Year's Eve dances and Consecration were family affairs. Saint Athanasios Greek Orthodox Church is like no other community! It's our Greek Orthodox Faith! In my mind, there's no other option. Why wouldn't you run toward the Orthodox Church where you receive love, peace and gain strength? That's where you want to be...in church...for the well-being of your family!"**

Due to similar backgrounds leading Greek dance troupes, this dedicated couple worked with Presvytera Argie upgrading the repertoire of dances and costumes within Saint Athanasios' Neophyte Dance Group—having fun teaching the youth traditional dances to perform at Greek Festivals. For 18 years, they also led the JOY Youth Group continuing this ministry long after their daughters had grown up.

Archdeacon Vasilios shares **"In our lives, we are very blessed not to experience tragedies. I remember being a little kid when one of our parishioners was killed in a head-on crash in Jamestown, New York. For one year, that family stayed away from attending Church/Divine Liturgy. I asked my mother 'Shouldn't they be coming to Church more?' One Holy Thursday during Lent, +Metropolitan Iakovos served Divine Liturgy to the elderly independently living at the Hollywood House—I had such a moving experience! From 1996-2004, it became an annual field trip providing amazing fun experiences for our daughters and youth spending much time together studying Liturgies! Meeting life's challenges, our spiritual journey is made easier within our Greek Orthodox community sharing joys and tears! Our family was working towards making progress through the prayers of teachers Betsy & Peter Nassos and George & Sheila Pullos who also had children—it was easy to raise a family within this extended family. Our kids wanted to go to Church—it became a part of the experience! We've tried to live our Faith! There have been days we don't feel like going to Divine Liturgy—then, we decide we're going! When on vacation, we visit a parish. It's difficult to grow in the Faith by yourself. The more you stay plugged into parish life when you have multiple touch points, it becomes more difficult to lose community! Youth/parishioners counted on us to lead JOY/Neophytes. The sacrament of Confession in our Church plays a vital role.**

**A washing...A regeneration...A renewal of baptism! Receiving this reflection/perspective from your Spiritual Father affects your soul/self...speaking to him about life situations. During confusion, having control becomes important to bring you back!"**


**"Our daughters' involvement with sports was creeping into Sundays after church. We did it for a while—rushing out after Divine Liturgy... changing clothes in parish parking lot. We weren't popular when we pulled them out of sports! Individual growth comes from continuous challenges we face! We now have grandchildren. I feel very thankful to be here!"** reflects Diakonissa Argie.

Grateful for God's blessings, Archdeacon Vasilios confessed **"Parishioners view me as a product of Saint Athanasios.** Christina Kandalepas always tells me 'You are our Deacon!' Dena Deligiannis lovingly exclaims 'You were taken from this parish! It's very touching! It's so cool to come back and see friends growing older like the Nassos, Metrou and Poulakidas parents, their children (Neophyte Dance Group participants) who are parents now and their grandchildren! They know us in Aurora!"
