

"In giving birth thou didst preserve thy virginity, in thy dormition thou didst not forsake the world, O Theotokos, thou was translated unto life, since thou art the mother of life, and by thy intercessions doest thou redeem our souls from death."

August, the crown of summer, is graced with one of the most beloved feasts in the life of the Church: the Dormition (Koimisis) of the Most Holy Theotokos, celebrated on August 15. Sometimes called the "Summer Pascha," this feast combines reverence, beauty, and deep theological meaning—reminding us that death, for those who are united to Christ, is not an end but a glorious beginning.

The word "Dormition" means "falling asleep." Unlike the typical understanding of death, the Church describes the Theotokos' departure from this life as a peaceful sleep, full of hope and without fear. Tradition holds that all the Apostles were miraculously gathered in Jerusalem to be present at her repose. Christ Himself received her soul, just as she once received Him in her womb. Her tomb, found empty three days later, is a sign of the resurrection promised to all who live and die in Him.

The Dormition is not merely a commemoration of the Virgin Mary's death. It is a declaration of our own destiny. The Theotokos—who bore Christ in her body, who stood by Him at the Cross, and who rejoiced in His Resurrection—is the first among the faithful to fully share in the fruits of Christ's victory over death. Her bodily assumption into heaven, though not a formal dogma in the Orthodox Church, is embraced as a sign that in Christ, humanity is lifted up into divine life.

To prepare for this feast, the Church offers us a fasting period from August 1–14 and the beautiful Paraklesis (Supplication) Canons, chanted on most evenings. In these moving hymns, we cry out to the Theotokos as our protector, healer, and intercessor. These services teach us to entrust our lives to her prayers, especially during times of sickness, trouble, and sorrow.

Let us embrace this season with prayer, fasting, and worship. Let us draw near to the Panagia not only with words, but with hearts that seek her Son. May her Dormition remind us that those who give their lives to Christ, as she did, are not swallowed by the grave but are raised into eternal life.







STEWARDSHIP

Understanding Stewardship Data: Strengthening Our Church's Future Part 2

One of the goals of the Stewardship Committee is to educate the Parish on the role Stewardship has in strengthening our Parish. Stewardship is the largest contributor to the financial health of our Parish. Currently, Stewardship contributes about 50-55% of our operating revenue. Our ultimate goal is to have Stewardship contribute 100% of our operating income. This achievement would allow us to reach Stewardship Independence, which we have discussed in previous Champion articles.

To help us monitor our progress towards this goal, we look at two key metrics:

- Number of Stewards increasing their Pledge
- 2. Average Pledge amount

When we introduced our 2025 Stewardship program in late 2024, we presented a 2025 goal that was 15% greater than our 2024 Stewardship level. This was our first step in the journey to achieving Stewardship Independence. Through the end of June, 60 or 26% of the Pledged 2025 Stewards have increased their commitment.

Currently, our average pledge amount is about \$1,200, which has been pretty consistent over the past 6 years. For us to achieve Stewardship Independence, the average Pledge needs to increase to about \$2,300.

The latest Stewardship data presents both progress and opportunities for growth — we are calling on each of us to reflect on our role in this collective effort.


It should be noted that the Stewardship Committee recognizes and understands that some Stewards within our community may have financial limitations that prevent them increasing their Pledge.

As we have said many times before, Stewardship is the lifeblood of our Parish, ensuring that ministries thrive, our mission expands, and our church remains a source of faith and community.





1965-2025

In November 1990, Vaia Papadimitriou of Soufli, Evrou, Greece was a graduate student at Chicago's Hyde Park University working to complete her PhD. in Particle Physics when she secured her first professional job as a Scientist at Fermilab (America's particle physics and accelerator laboratory). Fermilab offered her the postdoctoral Dr. Leon Lederman Fellowship. Dr. Vaia remembered, "From Warrenville where I lived, Saint Athanasios was the closest church. I was a local here from 1990-1995. With love and care, parishioners embraced me. Meeting Fr. Chris Constantinides and Deacon Vasilios Smith, I feel very privileged that I connected early on with the families of John and Margo Prokos, Costas and +Anna Baroukas and many others creating my support network, receiving wonderful love and lifelong friendships."

Beginning 1995-2003, Texas Tech University hired her to serve on their Faculty as an Assistant Professor, then Associate Professor and finally Full Professor. Every two weeks, she commuted to Texas staying in Illinois during her summers off from Teaching. In 2003, Dr. Vaia's hard-earned expertise and God-given Gifts were clearly recognized when Fermilab hired her as a Senior Scientist! Dr. Vaia revealed, "I prayed to Saint Athanasios asking him to bring me back here and he did! I moved to Batavia in 2003. I feel Saint Athanasios is my community and like being a part of it. I'm looking forward to coming to church and seeing everyone. In my life, I have several experiences with God's interventions. Either smaller or bigger things such as professional and health issues. I believe in the power of prayer and the power of the Saints' intercessions!"

"Under Christine Dreschler's leadership, I started teaching Saint Athanasios' 6th Grade Sunday School with Dr. Bessie Stavropoulos in 2006. In 2009, I taught 6th and 5th Grade Sunday School classes. From 2018-2021, I taught the High School class. Along with the curriculum, we collected students' questions on special topics. A favorite one was the relation between Science and Religion where we learned that they are complementary; they work in parallel and aren't contradicting each other. Throughout COVID, a special generation of kids were taught via ZOOM. The students are coming back, having interest. Not all of them but several of them. Being part of their lives is an honor at that delicate age. I like interacting with young people. When I was that age, many people gave me a lot and invested in me. I felt an obligation to do the same. I'm enjoying it. It's not a duty."
