

The passion and Resurrection of our Lord is upon us. It lies, not in the distant past as a memory, but before us as a promise and fulfillment. In the services of Holy Week, we experience the events of Christ's entry into Jerusalem, Crucifixion, and Resurrection as witnesses mystically present as they unfold. St. Gregory the Theologian reiterates this when he asks each of us to identify with those present at the events of Holy Week and to join them in their works.

"If you are Simon of Cyrene, take up the cross and follow. If you are crucified with him as the thief, come to know God as kindhearted...and if you are Joseph of Arimathea, ask for the body from the crucifier...and if you are Nicodemos, bury him with scented ointments. And if you are a certain Mary or another Mary or Salome or Joanna, weep and daybreak. Be the first to see the stone removed...become Peter or John; hasten to the tomb, running against each other, running together." (On Great and Holy Pascha, ch 24)


Echoing in the same voice, I invite all to live the events of Holy Week through the divine services; to enter Jerusalem with Him, to weep at the foot of His Cross, and to rejoice outside the Tomb as we hear the proclamation of His resurrection.

Most importantly, it is our prayer that throughout the entirety of the week, as many as are able will share in all of these acts together. The Resurrection of our Lord is a gift to all of mankind. Together, we rejoice as we follow the Lord. Together, we find the strength to bear His Crucifixion. Together, we rejoice as He is raised from the dead.

May we together embrace and experience the path of the Lord from beginning to end.

Blessed Pascha. Blessed Resurrection. Christ is Risen!



SPIRITUAL GROWTH CORNER

"And When You Pray"

Prayer is a gift from God that allows us to build a transformative relationship with Him. The prayers we learn through liturgical services, hymns, Scripture, prayer books, and Psalter help us understand who God is and His will for us, rather than relying on our own.

Fr. Thomas Hopko offers 55 maxims for the Christian life, including those focused on prayer:

- Pray as you can, not as you think you must
- Have a disciplined, keepable prayer rule
- Say the Lord's Prayer often
- Repeat a short prayer when the mind is not occupied
- · Make prostrations when praying
- As St. Nektarios of Aegina reminds us, "God hears all prayers and answers in ways we may not understand."



When presenting requests to God, always pray, "Thy will be done."



ORATORICAL FESTIVAL

Calling all 7th - 12 grade students: Participate in the Oratorical Festival! The St. John Chrysostom Oratorical Festival is a nationwide program of the Department of Religious Education (DRE) of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, where Orthodox youth present speeches discussing the Greek Orthodox faith and the Church. The Oratorical Festival is divided into the Senior Division (grades 10-12) and Junior Division (grades 7-9). Youth get to explore and deepen their faith and hone their speech writing and public speaking skills. Participants start at the Parish level, then proceed to the District or Metropolis level. And then, two finalists representing each Metropolis of the Archdiocese advance to the National Finals. All participants at the National Finals receive awards ranging from \$1,500 to \$7,000. Finalists at all levels are eligible to receive the Chrysostom Scholarship to Hellenic College ranging from \$2,500 to \$30,000 per year, to receive a credit for the pursuit of one undergraduate degree. Our high school classes will be incorporating the topics of the Oratorical Festival to prepare our students for this competition.

During the Fall 1978, Peter and Angie Condos visited Saint Athanasios Greek Orthodox Church twice after learning from John Digrindakis that a new parish even existed in Aurora accepting his invitation to take them to Divine Liturgy. Angie exclaimed "Everyone talked to us! Parishioners were so friendly! Previously, we attended an unfriendly parish for two years where no one spoke to us."

Weeks later, Angie's brother John and Terry Botsis visited Saint Athanasios. Terry reminisced "Parishioners gave us such a heartfelt greeting! Driving home after church, I told John this is the Orthodox Family we want to raise our family."

Peter (an Electrician) recalls, "Close friends with Saint Athanasios' priest Fr. John and Presbytera Alexandra Chakos, I was born and raised in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania in the same apartment building as Alexandra's family. Digrindakis invited us to his home meeting his family and parishioners who immediately recruited me. I was climbing 20-foot ladders in the hall to place ceiling tiles and public address system speakers. Parishioners bought 10 X 10 ft. square ceiling tiles donating monies. We dragged pallets leveling the corn field, planting seeds, landscaping and cutting grass."


John revealed "United parishioners had ONE VISION AND GOAL and never fought each other. We were always scrimping for money! No waste! Everything donated! We couldn't afford to hire out so the contractors allowed us to work on site building the hallways and painting walls...determined to complete the Community Center. The roof and walls were already constructed. We didn't have money but saved money utilizing parishioners' talents. There weren't many of us. William Kontos put in the wall and beautiful iconostasis in the hall. Teaching, guiding and mentoring us, we looked up to catalysts Harry Kouvavas, Harry Kontos and Nick Metrou who knew how to fearlessly fundraise asking restauranteurs and businesses to donate monies and equipment they had. We had the education while ALL old-timers possessed passion — an intense work ethic to build this church!"


Terry relayed "After finishing working their jobs, John and Peter went to church daily volunteering their skills, working side-by-side with Orthodox men, then arriving home to sleep. Angie and I spent evenings together taking care of our children. Frustrated that we hardly saw our husbands, we simultaneously understood they were doing a great thing. So proud of our husbands! Our Orthodox Church life, ethnicity and culture has enveloped us these years! We experienced everything together as a family."

Angie added "Terry and I had day jobs. At church volunteering with other parishioners, we cooked and cleaned in the kitchen for constant fundraisers and gatherings. Very warm atmosphere! Family! Saint Athanasios proved to be a great place to raise our kids. All children at church were always together!" Smiling, Peter remembers "Those early days, we were getting used to the building. No sewers. The basement was constantly flooding. Jim Lesiotis donated produce for countless fundraisers including first New Year Dance (1979, 100+ parishioners attended). The septic tank wasn't connected to City's system and overflowed. There weren't many parishioners then. Frequently, we mopped draining water cleaning hallway messes. This really nice parish has always had generous individuals in it."


