

The Presentation "Why You Will Marry the Wrong Person" is essential viewing material for all couples. Seriously. Watch the video on YouTube, it is only about 20 minutes long. The title is intended to get your attention, but the reflections are astute.

In this talk Alain de Botton covers every topic related to romantic love that one will face leading into a marriage. One of his most insightful sections is his discussion of Self-Knowledge. He claims that those around us, our parents, friends, and romantic partners know us better than we know ourselves, and he makes the point that an understanding of who we are "is out there but its not in me." As a result, we may struggle in love because we are unaware of our own tendencies and patterns. That lack of awareness, de Botton argues, comes from distraction/addiction. Now he explains that addiction is not necessarily related to substances but is rather "any pattern or behavior wherein you cannot stand to be alone with yourself and your more uncomfortable thoughts or emotions. You can be addicted to anything as long as it keeps you away from yourself." He mentions that our mobile devices have made it possible to live without ever truly coming into contact with ourselves.

The last piece to unpack of our parish's guiding biblical verse, that God desires "that all should be saved and come to the knowledge of truth" (1 Timothy 2:4), relates to truly knowing ourselves in Christ. I have previously mentioned (see the Dec 2023 Champion) that coming to the knowledge of truth is about coming to meet and experience Christ Himself. But in doing so we also come to the true knowledge of ourselves. God reveals to me my true self when I come to Him. His light shines upon my soul and exposes both my virtues and my sins. Knowing and seeing ourselves as God does becomes the foundation for our future spiritual efforts, cultivating virtue and eradicating sin. There is no room for blissful ignorance within a Christian progressing toward God's desired salvation.

Thus within the life of St. Athanasios our ministries and practices will become an opportunity for us to better know ourselves in Christ, to set aside the addictions that we use to distract us from coming into contact with ourselves. We do this first and foremost through the healing found in the sacrament of Confession. There are many hang ups about this sacrament:

Will Father Judge me or think less of me for what I say? – Unequivocally no. An article in our monthly publication cannot do justice to how intently the feeling of love and compassion pour out in the sacrament of Confession. Quite honestly it works the exact opposite of this fear. As a priest my love for someone only increases after hearing their confession.

Why do I even need to confess in front of a priest, can't I just ask God for forgiveness in my private prayers? – Of course, you can and should ask for forgiveness during your private prayers, just as you should take proper care of your body in your daily life. But regularly throughout the year, or when we get sick, we turn to a doctor to help address physical symptoms or ailments that we might not be equipped to handle. Likewise confessing in the presence of a priest allows the priest to guide your spiritual healing and self-discovery. The need of a doctor does not eliminate the need for daily healthy habits, just like the need of a priest does not eliminate the need for daily spiritual habits, and vice versa.

I encourage all in our parish to embrace this sacrament regularly as a practice within your journey to self-knowledge.

But if I may return to de Botton's original point about self-knowledge, while it might be diminished in us, others know us well. It is in fact the purpose of our interpersonal relationships within the Christian community to be mirrors, reflecting back to us opportunities for self-knowledge and growth. If interactions with my brothers and sisters in Christ are opportunities for me to interact with Christ, by virtue of the fact that they are made in His image, then these same interactions fulfill His role of illumining my virtues and vices. Friendships, koumbaroi, co-workers in ministry all serve vital roles in revealing me to myself. In fact this is the basic function of relationships: to know and to be known by others. So opportunities like our Small Groups or even the relationships you establish through the sacraments make certain "that all should be saved and come to the knowledge of truth."

We will continue our quarterly Hesed House dinner service on Thursday, February 29. Please consider volunteering your time for this rewarding event.






