Χριστός Ανέστη! Christ is Risen!

While we are still basking in the light of the Lord's resurrection, we at St. Athanasios have even more reason to joyfully celebrate. This year marks the 60th anniversary of the founding of our parish. In the years leading up to our founding many faithful in the Aurora area worked diligently to establish an Orthodox Church, among them a man affectionately known as Uncle Thanasi ($M\pi\alpha\rho\mu\pi\alpha$ Θανάση). In recognition of Thanasi's contribution toward the establishment of an Orthodox Church in Aurora, it was decided that the parish would eventually be named, St. Athanasios, in honor of Thanasi's patron saint.

50 years after that founding, through the visionary work of Fr. Peter Spiro, our parish was blessed to receive a relic of St. Athanasios, bringing the physical presence of our patron saint into our midst. This would be the first of many saints that Fr. Peter would bring to our community through the presence of their relics. It should be noted that few, if any parishes in the United States, are blessed to worship with such a choir of saints physically present within our Church.

May 2nd marks a special feastday in the life of the Church. It is the feast of the Translation of the Relics of St. Athanasios. St. Athanasios fell asleep in the Lord on May 2, 373AD and eventually his holy relics were brought from Alexandria, where he was the bishop, to Constantinople. There, the faithful celebrated St. Athanasios and the presence of his relics each year on the day of his repose.

Therefore, we are fortunate here in our own times, through the efforts of previous generations, like Uncle Thanasi and Fr. Peter, to be able to celebrate this feast in much the same way as the faithful in centuries past. Here we worship in a Church dedicated to St. Athanasios, blessed by the presence of his holy relics. I pray that through out the year we remember the men and women who have come before us to deliver this holy faith and beautiful parish into our hands.

STEWARDSHIP

Christ Is Risen! Over the last couple years, the Stewardship Committee has used the term Stewardship Independence in many of their communications. We would like to take this opportunity to expand on this vision and provide you some more background information on it. First of all, it is important for us to understand how our Stewardship Treasures are used. The primary use of these Treasures is to pay for our "day to day" operating expenses ...utilities, salaries, building maintenance items, ministries, etc. Currently, Stewardship pays for about 50% of our expenses with the remainder paid by external fundraisers. Our 2025 Stewardship Goal of \$408,3000 will result in Stewardship paying for about 60% of our operating expenses. Our 2025 Stewardship Goal reflects about a 15% increase over our 2024 level. We recognize that our achievement of Stewardship Independence will be a multi-year "journey" and will not happen overnight.

It is also important to note that to achieve our Stewardship Independence Goal, the average Stewardship Pledge will have to increase from its current level of about \$1,300 to about \$2,300. This assumes that our number of Stewards remains constant at about 300.

Once we achieve Stewardship Independence, we can use our external fundraisers in this manner:


- 1. Help cover the cost of major capital expenses that we incur related to ourbuildings and property.
- 2. Fund additional Philanthropic activities to help those within our ChurchCommunity and those outside our Church Community.

As you can see, we have a Stewardship vision that is the goal of many Parishes within the Metropolis. It will not be achieved overnight, but it is a goal that we should all striveto achieve.

Please look into your heart when you make your Stewardship commitment and take this Vision into consideration.





CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Christ is Risen! Χριστος Ανεστη! It seems just like yesterday that we were joyfully celebrating the feast day of our patron and rejoicing in the retirement of our mortgage. Time marches on, children grow, adults age, and often *communities evolve*.

As we saw on Holy Saturday, through the Catechumens who joined us our community is growing which is fantastic! And while growth is exciting, it's also accompanied by the reality that our beloved facilities are growing older too (a little like some of us).

The good news is if we take the time and effort now, we can successfully continue to grow our community and maintain our facilities. To achieve that goal, I am inviting all of you take the time to recommit to Phase Two of our Capital Campaign. To refresh ourselves:

What is Phase Two of the Capital Campaign?

Phase Two focuses on addressing the essential structural and maintenance needs of our building. In order to be on track to meet those needs we need to raise \$125,000 this year.

I don't remember what the building needs were. What are they?

We have identified four major building needs as follows:

- 1) landscape renovation
- 2) replacement of the three original HVAC systems including the boiler in the basement
- 3) replacement of the existing roof when needed
- 4) repair and upgrade the parking lot

Our 2025, objective is to raise \$125,000. As of March 31st, we are well on our way to achieving this goal. We have raised over \$57,000!! Thank you to everyone who has contributed so far.

Pete and Betsy Nassos travel the world but their most rewarding journey is the road they faithfully traverse together. They are firmly committed to their Eastern Orthodox Faith which guides them, their children Kara, Leah, Stacia and Philip and spouses, and six grandchildren. Betsy recalled "We were stewards at our parish in Austin, Texas. Orthodox Christians attended representing many ethnicities (i.e., Lebanese, Antiochians, Greek, etc.) The Divine Liturgy was mostly in English. The Lord's Prayer was recited in six languages. We experienced the beauty of Pan-Orthodoxy! As I was still a Catholic, the converted Orthodox priest (Scottish Episcopalian background) was after me to become Orthodox. My parents weren't Orthodox. I attended Catechism classes to better learn my Eastern Orthodox Faith."

In ways this family couldn't imagine, Pete's job transfer from Texas to Nalco Chemical Company in Naperville, Illinois in October 1985 proved to be a blessed Homecoming. Although Betsy's parents resided in Naperville, it was the Nassos' new friendly Greek Orthodox neighbors George and Sheila Pullos, Lou and Helen Halkias and others who invited them to the hospitable Saint Athanasios Greek Orthodox Church in Aurora.

"Saint Athanasios' parishioners opened up their arms making us feel welcome! The receptivity of everyone to us!," remembers Pete. "Bom and raised in a Greek Orthodox family on Chicago's south side, I respected Betsy's strong Roman Catholic traditions while we dated in college. We talked a great deal and needed this to be easy. As each child was born, we attended services from both Faiths."

Betsy explained "It was the caring attitude of our parishioners at Saint Athanasios! They could assist us where we were in our lives with very young children! There were lots of families. We became stewards of this vibrant community and attended Divine Liturgy with our kids. In May 1986, I was pregnant with Philip when I first forayed into the major annual Greek Food Festival parishioners actualized at the Kane County Fairgrounds in Saint Charles. After Dena Deligiannis saw me volunteering long hours, she brought me a thermos of warm milk. Pete was working the bar. It felt like we were home! We were one big family! In 1987, Pete co-chaired this Festival with our neighbor Dean Raptakis."

In 1987, Fr. Chris and Presvytera Angie Constantinides arrived at Saint Athanasios. Betsy thoughtfully reflected "I became close friends with Angie. At Philip's baptism in 1988, she came to me and asked 'Why haven't you converted?' I didn't have a good answer and told her 'I'm not ready.' Angie responded 'Let me know when you are ready.' She gave me books to read. Fr. Chris talked to me. I hadn't committed but taught Sunday School and volunteered at the Festival serving as Treasurer. Our kids enjoyed Sunday School, youth programs and serving in the Altar. The Apollo Dance Troupe (created by Dr. Michael and Eva Kontos) helped our kids relate to their Greek ethnicity! They didn't speak Greek. A positive experience! It was an easy transfer for our family to the Eastern Orthodox Church and Faith.

Our kids attended Catholic schools telling Catholic friends 'We are Orthodox!' People thought they were Jewish. During my natural progression after attending Divine Liturgy for ten years, I was chrismated one Sunday in church in 1988! My sponsor was Angie."

Working with Parish Council colleagues, Pete completed a Study forecasting expected growth in the Aurora-Naperville-Geneva corridor. Peter recalled "200 children attended Sunday School and Greek School. Dividers were put up and down to improvise classrooms in the church hall. An architect completed the Assessment/estimated cost regarding building additional classrooms. Animosity existed towards building. Lots of convincing before Approval by the General Assembly!"

Pete's job transferred the family to Phoenix, Arizona. They became stewards at the Cathedral which had a Welcoming Committee. Four years later, this family returned to Naperville. Betsy chuckled, "We implemented good ideas at Saint Athanasios hosting Welcome Dinners for new families. For years, I stood at the back of the church welcoming visitors including the Boznos family (= Fr. Panayiotis was a child)!" Χριστός Ανέστη! CHRIST IS RISEN!
