Fitness trainers are fond of the saying, "Summer bodies are built in the winter." Taking the energy from our "Speed Dating" experiment, the ministry leaders began the important task of bringing these ideas to life. Over the coming ministry year, we will see much more fellow work among our ministries and parishioners. Most importantly, we will refine our ministries so that we are fellow workers with God.

I thank all of the ministry leaders in our parish for their dedication and sacrifice to serve God's people, for their prayerful approach to joining in God's work, and for the bonds they build when working with one another.



STUMP THE PRIEST

It was announced in Church that Metropolitan Nathanael gave Fr. Panagiotis a new title and new part of his vestments to wear. What do these things mean?

Serving as a clergyman is very similar to serving within the military. There are three offices of clergy: Deacon, Priest, Bishop. Within each office there are different ranks, and the vestments that a particular clergyman wears tells you what their rank is, just like the insignia on a soldier's uniform.

For the priesthood the ranks are:

- 1. Presbyter
- 2. Confessor
- 3. Economos
- 4. Protopresbyter (married priests) or Archimandrite (celibate priests)

Each year, at the vespers for his namesday (June 10th), Metropolitan Nathanael bestows new ranks on select clergy. Last month, His Eminence blessed Fr. Panagiotis with the rank of Economos, the second highest rank for a married clergyman. Although the title is purely honorific at this point, originally the Economos was the clergyman responsible for overseeing all of the finances of a Metropolis.

As a sign of this rank, when a priest is made an Economos, he will begin to wear a diamond shaped piece of vestment called an Epigonation. In Greek the word epigonation means upon the knee (Epi-upon Gonata-knee), since it hangs down and rests on the right thigh/knee. The Epigonation originated as a piece of ceremonial clothing within the Byzantine Empire. High ranking officials and military commanders would wear a sword as part of their official dress. The epigonation was a piece of fabric or leather that covered the knee/thigh to protect the wearer's leg from the sword. Eventually the sword dropped out of fashion, but the epigonation stayed as a symbol of rank.

The prayer that the priest says while putting on the Epigonation keeps this connection to the sword and the military nature of clergy as soldiers in God's Kingdom.

Gird your sword upon Your thigh, O Mighty One, and in Your splendor and beauty string Your bow. Prosper and reign because of truth, meekness, and righteousness. Your right hand shall lead You wondrously always, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen.

BOOK REVIEW

CONFESSION: A Series of Lectures on the Mystery of Repentance by Metropolitan Anthony (Khrapovitsky).

Spiritual insight is packaged in this small book of 112 pages discussing one's soul with the voice of pastoral love of the author himself. Even though Confession seems to address spiritual Fathers, the book can be an every day life manual. Each chapter is dedicated to a particular passion one may struggle with, knowingly or unknowingly.

One can take value from numerous practical applications, such as how to expel envy from your heart, and how to find spiritual healing due to unbelief and weak faith, etc.

The book is almost offering "confession" without the confession and therefore, could be a good resource in preparing for confession as well, or may encourage one who avoided confession to move forward with it realizing that there is great spiritual force in the hands of faithful dergy for forgiveness of our sins.

To summarize, here is a quote from the book: "Lead religious life and you will find out for yourself the difference between temptation from the devil and those from your own evil will".






